The General Strike of 1926 was the biggest rupture in society since the English Civil War (1662). It lasted a mere nine days before being unconditionally sold out by the TUC leadership.

On May 10, 1926 (day 7), strikers accidentially derailed the Flying Scotsman at Cramlington. Eight Northumberland miners were imprisoned for a total of 48 years.

Almost a century later, their fascinating story is - finally - about to be told!

In 1926 a million miners were told to take a 40% cut in wages to "improve productivity" ie maintain the profits of the small number of pit owners. Huge wage cuts were also imposed on other sections of the workforce. The workers said no and Britain's only General Strike followed.
